

NEWS Mattatuck Sends Seven to National



Mattatuck Community College Director, Stuart Gillespie traveled with seven National Honors Choir participants to the ACDA National Honors Convention in Phoenix, Arizona last March to perform Beethoven's "Mass in C". The seven students, selected by a selection committee last fall. MCC had the distinct privilege of having seven students chosen from its choir of seventy.

The National Honors choir was directed by Dr. Douglas McEwen, a director from Phoenix who put together the Honors Choir and the Arizona State University Symphony Orchestra in the short span of four days and finished the preparation the 194 singers had begun on their own. (Music had been distributed a few months before the convention and Honors Choir members were charged with the task of knowing their scores before reaching the Arizona convention's first rehearsal on the evening of March 12.) Fine tuning and finishing touches took place at some very exciting rehearsals before the production took place. Students were treated to a rehearsal at Arizona State University and had the opportunity to look over the University and receive information that might be used in their fute college careers.

For most it was the first convention ever and a thrilling, rewarding experience. The students worked hard and learned a lot from Director Ewen and the ASU orchestra. They savored the musical presentations, had a fabulous time visiting the city of Phoenix and ASU. They returned exhausted, but inspired and were very grateful to be part of the


convention.

The 1991 Chamber Choir
Festival was held at Wesleyan
University's Crowell Concert Hall
on Friday, March 22, 1991. Ten
groups were slated to attend and nine participated.
Adjudicators included Dr. Paul Althouse of Ct.
College, who also directed the combined choir
selection "He Watching Over Israel", Dr. Pam
Perry of Central Ct. State University, Richard
Coffey of CONCORA and South Church in New
Britain, and Larry Allen who is director of the
Greater Middletown Chorale, a member of TRE
VOCES, as well as music director at Immanuel
Congregational Church of Hartford.

Students spent the day rehearsing the massed choir piece, performing for one another, working with the adjudicators, and enjoying

Wesleyan campus.

So, if you're looking for a place to show-case your small ensemble (30 or less), the ACDA Chamber Choir Festival may just be the place for you. Generally, there are 10 to 12 openings for high school choirs at the festival. Groups perform anything from madrigals to spirituals. The variety heard and the ideas shared make it a worthwhile experience for all.

This year's festival will be moved to the end of April so as not to conflict with the CMEA All-State Festival that is moved from May to March. There should be no conflict with vacations

because most schools will already have had theirs earlier in the month. If you're already planning a trip during vacation, why not show off a little at

home, too?

The Chamber Festival is held on a Friday from approximately 10 am to 9 pm. There is sharing, caring, and positive reinforcement for all with the noncompetitive adjudication format. The adjudicators are quality artists from the area and are coached in advance by each director concerning their group. The cost is \$125 for the day plus additional costs for meals. More details will be upcoming in the next edition of CANTABILE.




As the summer slips blissfully by, I offer a few ideas that I will continue to implement at my high school this coming year. I am incorporating some ideas of Scott Schuler, Music Consultant for the State Department of Education. As arts programs are being slashed throughout our region, Mr. Schuler suggests that unless we become more accountable in the curricula of our classes and rehearsals, then administrations may consider us to be extra-curricular and therefore, expendable when budget cuts are necessary.

Thanks to the sharing of ideas on the secondary level in West Hartford, I have started teaching about a composer each term. I pick out a piece of music that students will study and perform. I write a short biography about the composer and include a few other works that the students listen to in class, and are responsible for recognizing. After the initial presentation of information, I refer to the composer of the works every few days in class. Every other week I give a short quiz with questions from the biography. This past term four of my classes worked on Beethoven "Hallelujah" from the Mount of Olives. I also played excerpts from Symphony #5, the first movement, Symphony #9, fourth movement, and "Fur Elise." With my freshmen choir, we worked on a piece from "Phantom of the Opera", studied the story, and learned information about Andrew Lloyd Webber. In addition to learning about composers, I also have a short 5 to 7 minute period of sight reading at the beginning of each class before I start rehearsing. This approach of teaching the students more than just the notes on the page may also be helpful in ensuring the viability of our programs.


